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# EBRI to Release Health Confidence Survey Wednesday, Oct. 25

The nonpartisan Employee Benefit Research Institute (EBRI) will release its ninth annual Health Confidence Survey (HCS) on <u>Wednesday</u>, Oct. 25, 2006. This year's survey will address such questions as:

- What impact have rising health care costs had on Americans' satisfaction with the U.S. health care system?
- How satisfied are Americans with their own health care plan?
- What health care issues should be priorities for Congress?

## The Health Confidence Survey

The survey is co-sponsored by EBRI and Mathew Greenwald & Associates, a public opinion and market research organization, and is based on 20-minute telephone interviews with 1,000 U.S. residents ages 21 and older. Since 1998, the Health Confidence Survey has tracked a broad spectrum of health care issues of interest to the American public.

#### How the survey will be released

This year's survey will be released at 12:01 a.m. EDT, Wednesday, Oct. 25. An embargoed press release will be e-mailed to reporters and EBRI subscribers at noon EDT Tuesday, Oct. 24, to accommodate reporters who wish to publish or broadcast stories on the morning of Oct. 25. An *EBRI Notes* article detailing the main survey findings and the press release will be posted on the EBRI Web site, www.ebri.org, early on Oct. 25.
