


After Years of Erosion, Employers Increasingly Offer Health Coverage


INCREASING COVERAGE, MORE COVERED

In 2017, the overall percentage of private-sector employers offering health benefits increased for the first time between 2008 and 2017.



ON THE REBOUND

Nearly all large employers continue to offer coverage. The beginning of a rebound appears in companies with fewer than 1,000 employees starting in 2015.
